Australia has a long history of religion, specifically Christianity. However, over the past 50 years, there has been a steady decline in the number of Australians who reported an affiliation with Christianity. Many people have been reached with the Gospel due to its long history, but out of 207 people groups there are still 34 people groups who are unreached.

What is an Unreached People Group (UPG)? An UPG virtually has no followers of Jesus and no known movements to Jesus and still needs cross-cultural workers. Read more about who these people are and how they are being reached.
